Amends GS 143-139(b) as title indicates. Provides that "industrial machinery" includes machinery used for the explicit purpose of producing a product, but does not include equipment that is permanently attached to or is a component part of a building and is related to general building services, such as heating and cooling, plumbing, or general electrical transmission. **Intro. by Hoyle.** GS 143

S 490. INDUSTRIAL MACHINERY—BUILDING CODE. Filed 3/5/07. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Provides that during the building code inspection process, an electrical inspector may refer concerns about the safety of industrial machinery to the Occupational Safety and Health Division in the NC Department of Labor. However, those concerns may not be the only basis for withholding the certificate of occupancy or mandating third-party testing of the industrial machinery.
