H 1474. CREDIT EDUCATION REQ'D/HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS. Filed 4/9/09. MANDATING A WEEK OF "CREDIT EDUCATION" FOR ALL HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS.

Amends GS 115C-81(i) to provide that, during the senior year, each public school student must receive a block of 10 hours of instruction in an appropriate course, as defined by the State Board of Education, on the use of credit. Requires that the course include (1) the true cost of credit, (2) choosing and managing a credit card, (3) borrowing money for an automobile or other large purchase, (4) home mortgages, (5) credit scoring and credit reports, and (6) other relevant financial literacy issues. Makes a conforming change. Effective for the 2010-11 school year.

H 1474. CREDIT EDUCATION REQ'D/HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS. Filed 4/9/09. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Changes title to AN ACT MANDATING A WEEK OF "CREDIT EDUCATION" FOR ALL HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS. Amends proposed change to GS 115C-81(i) by eliminating requirement that 10-hour block on the use of credit be taken during a student's senior year and instead requires that each student receive at some time during high school years one week of instruction on the use of credit.

H 1474. CREDIT EDUCATION REQUIRED FOR STUDENTS (NEW). Filed 4/9/09. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Changes title to *AN ACT REQUIRING "CREDIT EDUCATION" FOR ALL STUDENTS*. Amends GS 115C-81(i) to eliminate references to high school and permit the State Board of Education to determine into which courses and grade levels the credit education will be integrated and to eliminate requirement that the credit education be one week of instruction. Effective when the act becomes law and applies beginning with the 2011-12 school year (was, 2010-11).
