H 1492. UNC TUITION AMENDMENTS. Filed 4/9/09. TO PROVIDE THAT TUITION MAY BE CHARGED TO STUDENTS WHO ATTEND THE NORTH CAROLINA SCHOOL OF SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS, TO REPEAL THE LAW THAT AUTHORIZES IN-STATE TUITION STATUS FOR OUT-OF-STATE STUDENTS WHO ARE AWARDED FULL SCHOLARSHIPS, AND TO INCREASE THE TUITION SURCHARGE.

Amends GS 116-143(b) to eliminate the prohibition on the UNC Board of Governors or its Board of Trustees from imposing any tuition or mandatory fee at the NC School of Science and Mathematics without the General Assembly's approval.

Repeals GS 116-143.6 (related to allowing full scholarship students attending UNC constituent institutions to be considered state residents). Provides that a student with a full scholarship who has in-state tuition status on July 1, 2009, continues to be eligible for in-state tuition for the period that student receives the scholarship.

Amends Section 89(b) of SL 1993-321, as amended, to impose a 100\% (was, 25\%) tuition surcharge on students who take more than 140 degree credit hours to complete a baccalaureate degree in a four-year program or more than $110 \%$ of the credit hours necessary to complete a baccalaureate degree in any program officially designated by the UNC Board of Governors as a five-year program. Applies to students who will be freshmen and sophomores in the 2009-10 fall academic semester and all students who enroll on or after July 1, 2009.

Changes title to AN ACT TO REPEAL THE LAW THAT AUTHORIZES IN-STATE TUITION STATUS FOR OUT-OF-STATE STUDENTS WHO ARE AWARDED FULL SCHOLARSHIPS, AND TO INCREASE THE TUITION SURCHARGE. Deletes the amendments to GS 116-143(b) which would have allowed students who attend the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics to be charged tuition. Renumbers remaining sections of the act.
