H 1633. UPGRADE SECURITY SERVICES-GOVERNMENT COMPLEX. Filed 5/6/09. *TO REQUIRE UPGRADED SECURITY AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AT THE STATE LEGISLATURE, STATE GOVERNMENT COMPLEX, THE EXECUTIVE MANSION, AND THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR'S MANSION AND TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE UPGRADED SECURITY SERVICES.*

As the title indicates. Appropriates \$1 million from the General Fund to the Legislative Services Commission for the State Legislature; appropriates \$250,000 from the General Fund to the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety for the Executive mansion and the Lieutenant Governor's mansion; and appropriates \$5 million from the General Fund to the Department of Administration for the State Government Complex. Effective July 1, 2009.

H 1633. STUDY SECURITY SERVICES-LEGISLATIVE BLDGS. (NEW). Filed 5/6/09. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Deletes the entire contents of the previous edition and replaces it with *AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE STUDY COMMITTEE ON SECURITY AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AT THE STATE LEGISLATIVE BUILDINGS*. Establishes the 14 member Joint Legislative Study Committee on Security and Emergency Medical Services at the State Legislative Buildings (Committee) to determine whether and to what extent the security and emergency medical services need to be upgraded at the state legislative buildings and grounds. Provides that seven members be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and seven members be appointed by the President Pro Tem. of the Senate as specified. Provides for meeting times, filling of vacancies, expenses, staff, and designation of cochair. Specifies duties of the Committee. Requires a report to the 2010 Regular Session of the 2009 General Assembly. Terminates the Committee on May 1, 2010, or upon the filing of its final report, whichever occurs first.
