H 1708. CLEAN MARINAS AMENDMENTS. Filed 5/13/10. *TO DELAY THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE CLEAN COASTAL WATER AND VESSEL ACT FROM JULY 1, 2010, TO DECEMBER 1, 2010, AND TO LIMIT THE ACT'S APPLICATION TO ONLY THOSE AREAS THAT ARE DESIGNATED AS NO DISCHARGE ZONES BY THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW COMMISSION.*

Amends GS 77-131 and SL 2009-345, as title indicates.

H 1708. CLEAN MARINAS AMENDMENTS. Filed 5/13/10. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Amends Section 3 of SL 2009-345 to extend the effective date of the Clean Coastal Water and Vessel Act to April 1, 2011 (was, December 1, 2010, in the 1st edition). Makes a conforming change to the title.

H 1708. CLEAN MARINAS AMENDMENTS. Filed 5/13/10. Senate amendment makes the following changes to 2nd edition.

Amends GS 113A-115.1 to add a definition for *terminal groin*. Defines the term to mean a groin that is constructed on the side of an inlet to limit or control sediment passage into the inlet channel.

Current law prohibits a person from constructing a permanent erosion control structure or a temporary erosion control structure consisting of anything other than a sandbag in an ocean shoreline. Enacts a new subsection (d) to GS 113A-115.1 to allow the Coastal Resources Commission to authorize the construction of a terminal groin as a sediment management device pursuant to a variance under GS 113A-120.1. Specifies the conditions that must be met in order to secure a permit authorizing the construction of a terminal groin. Requires that every application for a permit to construct a terminal groin be accompanied by an environmental impact statement. Also requires the permit to require the permittee to provide financial assurance in an amount that would cover removing the groin if it is determined that the groin has an adverse impact on the environment or other properties that cannot be sufficiently mitigated.

Amends the title to reflect the bill content.
