H 1807. SUPPORTING COMPREHENSIVE FEDERAL CLIMATE CHANGE LEGISLATION.
Filed 5/18/10. REQUESTING THE PRESIDENT AND THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO
ADOPT LEGISLATION THAT PROMOTES JOBS AND INNOVATIVE ENERGY
DEVELOPMENT, STRENGTHENS NATIONAL ENERGY AND ECONOMIC SECURITY,
POSITIONS THE UNITED STATES TO BE AN INTERNATIONAL LEADER IN THE FIELD OF
CLEAN ENERGY, AND ADDRESSES THE CONSEQUENCES OF CLIMATE CHANGE
WITHOUT PREEMPTING STATES' RIGHTS TO CONTROL EMISSIONS AND TO PROMOTE
RENEWABLE ENERGY, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON
GLOBAL CLIMATE CHANGE.

Calls specially for legislation that (1) creates a unified framework for reducing greenhouse gas emissions, (2) protects low and moderate income individuals from increased energy costs and invests in energy efficiency, (3) supports alternative sources of energy, (4) includes emissions offsets, and (5) does not preempt state efforts to control emissions and advance clean energy innovations.
