1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE APPLICABILITY OF THE LAW REQUIRING DRIVERS TO 3 PULL OVER AND STOP WHEN APPROACHED BY A FIRE OR RESCUE VEHICLE, TO CLARIFY THAT PUBLIC SERVICE VEHICLES ARE COVERED UNDER THE 4 5 MOVE OVER LAW, TO MODIFY THE CURRENT PROHIBITION ON PARKING ON 6 HIGHWAYS OR HIGHWAY SHOULDERS, TO CHANGE THE TIME PERIOD IN 7 THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES WHICH MUST HOLD AN 8 ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING FOR A VIOLATION OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE 9 INSPECTION PROGRAM STATUTES BY AN EMISSIONS INSPECTION STATION 10 LICENSE HOLDER, TO CLARIFY RESTRICTIONS ON OPERATING A SCHOOL BUS OR ACTIVITY BUS WHILE OCCUPIED BY A CHILD OR CHILDREN, TO 11 12 EXEMPT DISTRIBUTIONS OF PROCEEDS DERIVED FROM GARVEE BONDS 13 FROM THE STATE EQUITY DISTRIBUTION FORMULA FOR TRANSPORTATION 14 FUNDS, AND TO SPECIFY THAT THE YELLOW LIGHT DURATION INTERVAL 15 FOR A TRAFFIC CONTROL PHOTOGRAPHIC SYSTEM BE SPECIFIED IN A TRAFFIC SIGNAL PLAN SIGNED AND SEALED BY A PROFESSIONAL 16 17 ENGINEER.

18 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 19

SECTION 1. G.S. 20-157(a) reads as rewritten:

Upon the approach of any law enforcement or fire department vehicle or public or 20 "(a) 21 private ambulance or rescue squad emergency service vehicle giving warning signal by appropriate light and by audible bell, siren or exhaust whistle, audible under normal conditions 22 from a distance not less than 1000 feet, the driver of every other vehicle shall immediately 23 24 drive the same to a position as near as possible and parallel to the right-hand edge or curb, clear of any intersection of streets or highways, and shall stop and remain in such position unless 25 otherwise directed by a law enforcement or traffic officer until law enforcement or fire 26 27 department vehicle or public or private ambulance or rescue squad emergency service vehicle shall have passed. Provided, however, this subsection shall not apply to vehicles traveling in 28 29 the opposite direction of the vehicles herein enumerated when traveling on a four lane limited 30 access highway with a median divider dividing the highway for vehicles traveling in opposite 31 directions, and provided further that the violation of this subsection shall be negligence per se. Violation of this subsection is a Class 2 misdemeanor." 32

Standard qualifications for school bus drivers; speed limit for school buses and 1 2 school activity buses. 3 Qualifications. - No person shall drive a school bus over the highways or public (a) 4 vehicular areas of North Carolina while it is occupied by children one or more child passengers 5 unless the person furnishes to the superintendent of the schools of the county in which the bus shall be operated a certificate from any representative duly designated by the Commissioner 6 7 and from the Director of Transportation or a designee of the Director in charge of school buses 8 in the county showing that the person has been examined by them and is fit and competent to 9 drive a school bus over the highways and public vehicular areas of the State. The driver of a school bus must be at least 18 years of age and hold a Class A, B, or C commercial drivers 10 11 license and a school bus driver's certificate. The driver of a school activity bus must meet the 12 same qualifications as a school bus driver or must have a license appropriate for the class of 13 vehicle being driven. 14 (b) Speed Limits. - It is unlawful to drive a school bus loaded with children-occupied by one or more child passengers over the highways or public vehicular areas of the State at a 15 greater rate of speed than 45 miles per hour. It is unlawful to drive a school activity bus loaded 16 17 with children loaded with one or more child passengers over the highways or public vehicular 18 areas of North Carolina at a greater rate of speed than 55 miles per hour. 19 Punishment. – A person who violates this section commits a Class 3 misdemeanor." (c) 20 SECTION 7. G.S. 136-17.2A(i) is repealed. 21 SECTION 8. G.S. 160A-300.1(c1) reads as rewritten: 22 "(c1) The duration of the yellow light change interval at intersections where traffic control 23 photographic systems are in use shall be no less than the yellow light change interval duration 24 specified in the Design Manual developed by the Signals and Geometrics Section of the North 25 Carolina Department of Transportation.on the traffic signal plan of record signed and sealed by 26 a professional engineer, licensed in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 89C of the 27 General Statutes, and shall comply with the provisions of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices." 28 29 SECTION 9. G.S. 160A-303(b1)(4) reads as rewritten: 48 Is left on any public street or highway for longer than seven days.days or is "(4) 49 determined by law enforcement to be a hazard to the motoring public."

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SECTION 12. Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, and 6 of this act become effective December 1, 1

2 2009, and apply to offenses committed on or after that date. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.

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
