7	RESOURCES DESIGNATED AS THE ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE AND		
8	MOTORCYCLE OFF-ROAD FUND TO BE USED FOR ACQUISITION,		
9	CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, AND OPERATION OF ALL-TERRAIN		
10	VEHICLE AND MOTORCYCLE RECREATION TRAILS AND TO PROVIDE SAFETY

14	SECTION 1. G.S. 20-50 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:		
15	"(a1) Except for vehicles exempted from registration under G.S. 20-51 or used primarily		
16	for agricultural purposes or by law enforcement, fire, rescue, and emergency medical service		
17	personnel in the performance of their duties, an all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle that meets all		
18	of the following criteria shall be registered with the Division in accordance with G.S. 20-53.1:		
19	(1) The all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle is not otherwise required to be		
20	registered.		
21 22	(2) <u>The all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle was manufactured in the year 2005 or</u> later.		
23	(3) The all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle is intended for off-road operation."

governments, and to qualified nonprofit organizations, for acquisition, construction, 6

maintenance, and operation of all-terrain vehicle and motorcycle off-road recreation trails, to 7

8 provide law enforcement for the trails, and to provide safety training for the operators of

9 all-terrain vehicles and motorcycles registered for off-road use." 10

SECTION 7. This act becomes effective July 1, 2010.
