The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
SECTION 1. Chapter 15A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
Article to read:
"Article 47.
"Local Crime Stoppers Programs.
"§ 15A-850. Local Crime Stoppers organizations; confidentiality.
(a) Definition. – As used in this section, a "Crime Stoppers" organization or other
similarly named organization means a private, nonprofit North Carolina corporation governed by a civilian volunteer board of directors that is operated on a local or statewide level that (i)
offers anonymity to persons providing information to the organization, (ii) accepts and expends
donations for cash rewards to persons who report to the organization information about alleged
criminal activity and that the organization forwards to the appropriate law enforcement agency,
and (iii) is established as a cooperative alliance among the news media, the community, and
law enforcement officials.
(b) Confidentiality of Crime Stoppers Tips. – Evidence of a communication or any
information contained therein between a person submitting a report of an alleged criminal act to
a Crime Stoppers organization and the person who accepted the report on behalf of the
organization is not subject to discovery or admissible in any court proceeding, regardless of the



Enforcement Agency to Maintain Confidentiality. - The identity of any individual providing

information about a crime or criminal activity to a Crime Stoppers organization under a

promise of anonymity is not a public record as defined by G.S. 132-1 and shall not be

disclosed. A law enforcement agency receiving information concerning alleged criminal

activity from a Crime Stoppers organization shall maintain confidentiality pursuant to this
