5	(d) The clerk to the governing board shall maintain a record verifying receipt of the

11	SECTION 3. G.S. 115C-50 reads as rewritten:
12	"§ 115C-50. Training of board members.
13	(a) All members of local boards of education education, whether elected or appointed,
14	shall receive a minimum of 12 clock hours of training annually. The 12 clock hours of training
15	may include the ethics education required by G.S. 160A-84.
16	(b) The training shall include but not be limited to public school law, public school
17	finance, and duties and responsibilities of local boards of education.
18	(c) The training may be provided by the North Carolina School Boards Association, the
19	School of Government at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, or other qualified
20	sources at the choice of the local board of education."

35	SECTION 6. Part 2 of Article 2 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is
36	amended by adding a new section to read:
37	" <u>§ 130A-49.5. Ethics.</u>
38	(a) The governing board shall adopt a resolution or policy containing a code of ethics,
39	as required by G.S. 160A-83.
40	(b) All members of the governing board, whether elected or appointed, shall receive the
41	ethics education required by G.S. 160A-84."
42	SECTION 7. The resolution or policy containing a code of ethics that is required
43	by G.S. 160A-83 shall be adopted by each municipality, county, local board of education,
44	unified government, sanitary district, and consolidated city-county on or before January 1,
45	2011. The governing board may look to model local government codes of ethics for guidance
46	in developing the resolution or policy.
47	SECTION 8. This act is effective when it becomes law.
