<b>SECTION 3.</b> While in the discharge of its official duties, the Committee may		



exercise all powers provided for under G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4.

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Members of the Committee shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowance as provided in G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138.6, as appropriate. With the prior approval of the Legislative Services Commission, the Legislative Services Officer shall assign professional and clerical staff to assist the Committee in its work. The House of Representatives' Director of Legislative Assistants shall assign clerical staff to the Committee. The Committee may contract for professional, clerical, or consultant services as provided by G.S. 120-32.02. The Committee may meet in the Legislative Building or Legislative Office Building and may meet at various locations around the State in order to promote greater public participation in its deliberations.

**SECTION 4.** The Committee shall submit a final report to the 2009 General Assembly, Regular Session 2010 and may submit interim reports as it deems necessary. The Committee shall terminate upon filing its final report or upon the convening of the 2010 General Assembly, whichever comes first.

**SECTION 5.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
