2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES
3	TO REGISTER ANIMAL SHELTERS UNDER THE NORTH CAROLINA
4	CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ACT FOR THE LIMITED PURPOSE OF OBTAINING,
5	POSSESSING, AND USING DRUGS FOR ANIMAL EUTHANASIA, TO AUTHORIZE
6	CERTIFIED EUTHANASIA TECHNICIANS TO ADMINISTER THESE DRUGS TO
7	EUTHANIZE DOGS AND CATS ON THE PREMISES OF THE ANIMAL SHELTER,
8	AND TO GIVE THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND CONSUMER
9	SERVICES EXPLICIT AUTHORIZATION TO REJECT CERTIFICATION OF OR TO
10	DECERTIFY A EUTHANASIA TECHNICIAN FOR CERTAIN FELONY
11	CONVICTIONS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE GENERAL STATUTES
12	COMMISSION.
13	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
14	SECTION 1. G.S. 90-101 reads as rewritten:
15	"§ 90-101. Annual registration and fee to engage in listed activities with controlled
16	substances; effect of registration; exceptions; waiver; inspection.
17	(a) Every person who manufactures, distributes, dispenses, or conducts research with
18	any controlled substance within this State or who proposes to engage in any of these activities
19	shall annually register with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, in
20	accordance with rules adopted by the Commission, and shall pay the registration fee set by the
21	Commission for the category to which the applicant belongs. An applicant for registration shall
22	file an application for registration with the Department of Health and Human Services and
23	submit the required fee with the application. The categories of applicants and the maximum fee
24	for each category are as follows:

2	(a1) Any physician who prescribes or dispenses Buprenorphine for the treatment of
3	opiate dependence shall annually register with the Department, in accordance with rules
4	adopted by the Commission. In the application for registration under this subsection, the
5	applicant shall document plans to ensure that patients are directly engaged or referred to a
6	qualified provider to receive counseling and case management, as appropriate, and shall
7	acknowledge the application of federal confidentiality regulations to patient information.
8	Applicant plans for referral to appropriate services shall be a written document and may include
9	either an executed memorandum of agreement, contractual arrangement, or linkage agreement
10	with qualified providers. The Department shall provide assistance upon request to physicians
11	registered under this subsection to identify and establish linkages with qualified providers of
12	counseling and case management. The Department shall provide the North Carolina Medical
12	Board with any evidence of noncompliance with this subsection by a qualified physician prior
13 14	to taking action to rescind the physician's registration to prescribe or dispense Buprenorphine
15	for the treatment of opiate dependency. (a^2) An animal shelter may register under this section for the limited number of
16 17	(a2) An animal shelter may register under this section for the limited purpose of
17	obtaining, possessing, and using sodium pentobarbital and other drugs approved by the
18	Department in consultation with the North Carolina Veterinary Medical Association for the
19	euthanasia of animals lawfully held by the animal shelter. An animal shelter registered under
20	this section shall also register with the federal Drug Enforcement Agency under the federal
21	Controlled Substances Act. An animal shelter's acquisition of sodium pentobarbital and other
22	approved drugs for use in the euthanizing of animals shall be made only by the shelter's
23	manager or chief operating officer or by a licensed veterinarian.
24	A person certified by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to administer
25	euthanasia by injection is authorized to possess and administer sodium pentobarbital and other
26	approved euthanasia drugs for the purposes of euthanizing domestic dogs (Canis familiaris) and
27	cats (Felis domestica) lawfully held by an animal shelter. Possession and administration of
28	sodium pentobarbital and other approved drugs for use in the euthanizing of dogs and cats by a
29	certified euthanasia technician shall be limited to the premises of the animal shelter.
30	For purposes of this section, "animal shelter" means an animal shelter registered under
31	Article 3 of Chapter 19A of the General Statutes and owned, operated, or maintained by a unit
32	of local government or under contract with a unit of local government for the purpose of
33	housing or containing seized, stray, homeless, quarantined, abandoned, or unwanted animals.
34	(b) Persons registered by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services
35	under this Article (including research facilities) to manufacture, distribute, dispense or conduct
36	research with controlled substances may possess, manufacture, distribute, dispense or conduct
37	research with those substances to the extent authorized by their registration and in conformity
38	with the other provisions of this Article.
39	(c) The following persons shall not be required to register and may lawfully possess
40	controlled substances under the provisions of this Article:
41	(1) An agent, or an employee thereof, of any registered manufacturer,
42	distributor, or dispenser of any controlled substance if such agent is acting in
43	the usual course of his business or employment;
44	(2) The State courier service operated by the Department of Administration, a
45	common or contract carrier, or a public warehouseman, or an employee
46	thereof, whose possession of any controlled substance is in the usual course
47	of his business or employment;
48	(3) An ultimate user or a person in possession of any controlled substance
49	pursuant to a lawful order of a practitioner;
