1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE A MEMBER OF THE ARMED FORCES OR OF RESERVE  
3 COMPONENTS OF THE ARMED FORCES TO RENEW A DRIVERS LICENSE UPON  
4 RECEIPT OF DEPLOYMENT ORDERS AND TO ALLOW A SIXTY-DAY GRACE  
5 PERIOD FOR AN EXPIRED LICENSE UPON RELEASE FROM ACTIVE DUTY.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 20-4.01 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:

8 "(33c) Reserve components of the Armed Forces of the United States. – The  
9 organizations listed in Title 10 United States Code, section 10101, which  
10 specifically includes the Army and Air National Guard."

11 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 20-7(f) reads as rewritten:

12 "(f) Duration and Renewal of Licenses. – Drivers licenses shall be issued and renewed  
13 pursuant to the provisions of this subsection:

14 ...

15 (3b) Renewal for certain members of the Armed Forces and reserve components  
16 of the Armed Forces.

17 a. The Division may renew a drivers license, without limitation on the  
18 period of time before the license expires, if the person applying for  
19 renewal is a member of the Armed Forces or of a reserve component  
20 of the Armed Forces of the United States and provides orders that  
21 place the member on active duty and duty station outside this State.

22 b. A person who is a member of a reserve component of the Armed  
23 Forces of the United States whose license bears an expiration date  
24 that occurred while the person was on active duty outside this State  
25 shall be considered to have a valid license until 60 days after the date  
26 of release from active duty upon showing proof of the release date,  
27 unless the license was rescinded, revoked, or otherwise invalidated  
28 under some other provision of law. Notwithstanding the provisions of  
29 this sub-subdivision, no license shall be considered valid more than  
30 18 months after the date of expiration.

31 (4) Renewal by mail. – The Division may renew by mail a drivers license issued  
32 by the Division to a person who meets any of the following descriptions:



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- 1 a. Is a member of the Armed Forces or a reserve component of the
- 2 Armed Forces of the United States serving on active duty ~~in the~~
- 3 ~~armed forces of the United States~~ and is stationed outside this State.
- 4 b. Is a resident of this State and has been residing outside the State for
- 5 at least 30 continuous days.

6 When renewing a license by mail, the Division may waive the examination  
 7 that would otherwise be required for the renewal and may impose any  
 8 conditions it finds advisable. A license renewed by mail is a temporary  
 9 license that expires 60 days after the person to whom it is issued returns to  
 10 this State.

11 ...."

12 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 20-7(r) reads as rewritten:

13 "(r) Waiver of Vision Test. – The following license holders shall be exempt from any  
 14 required eye exam when renewing a drivers license by mail under either subsection (f) of this  
 15 section or subsection (q) of this section if, at the time of renewal, the license holder is serving  
 16 in a combat zone or a qualified hazardous duty zone:

- 17 (1) A member of the ~~armed forces~~ Armed Forces of the United States.
- 18 (2) A member of ~~the national guard or of~~ a reserve component of the ~~armed~~  
 19 ~~forces~~ Armed Forces of the United States."

20 **SECTION 4.** The Revisor of Statutes shall change the term "armed forces" to  
 21 "Armed Forces" wherever that term appears in Chapter 20 of the General Statutes.

22 **SECTION 5.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to all licenses  
 23 expiring on or after the effective date of this act.
