1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY AND EXPAND THE AUTHORITY OF THE TOWN OF
3	CAROLINA BEACH TO REGULATE AND ENFORCE LAWS IN CAROLINA BEACH
4	HARBOR AND THE SHORELINE AREA ADJOINING THE TOWN.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. Definitions. – The following definitions apply in this act:
7	(1) "Shoreline area" means the land and water areas extending from the
8	corporate boundaries of the Town of Carolina Beach to a distance of 200
9	yards in parallel lines from the corporate boundaries. This area includes
10	Carolina Beach Harbor, the Municipal Marina, and Yacht Basin. This area
11	does not include: (i) the shoreline areas along the Atlantic Ocean; (ii) the
12	Intracoastal Waterway and all areas within its right-of-way; and (iii) any
13	area within the corporate boundaries of another city or town organized
14	pursuant to Chapter 160A of the General Statutes.
15	SECTION 2. Purposes. – The purposes of this act are to clarify and expand the
16	authority of the Town of Carolina Beach to:
17	(1) Operate and manage facilities in Carolina Beach Harbor, the Municipal
18	Marina, and Yacht Basin.
19	(2) Enforce navigation, boating, water safety, resource protection, recreation,
20	and public safety laws in the shoreline area in cooperation and coordination
21	with applicable local, State, and federal agencies.
22	SECTION 3. Effect of ordinances in the shoreline area. – The Town may adopt
23	ordinances pursuant to G.S. 160A-174 and extend applicable ordinances of the Town so that
24	the ordinances have full force and effect in the shoreline area, subject to the limitation that in
25	the event any ordinance adopted by the Town conflicts with a rule, regulation, or statute
26	adopted by a county, State, or federal agency, then the county, State, or federal rule, regulation,
27	or statute shall prevail over the Town ordinance to the extent of the conflict. The Town shall
28	not adopt or extend an ordinance to apply to the shoreline area that would interfere or limit
29	public trust rights of the people of the State or legal rights of access to such public trust areas in
30	any way.
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SECTION 4. Police jurisdiction. – In addition to their authority within the corporate boundaries of the Town and as otherwise provided by law, Town law enforcement officers shall have authority to enforce ordinances adopted or extended pursuant to Section 3 of this act in the shoreline area, subject to the limitations of their subject matter jurisdiction and

any existing enforcement authority in those areas held by county, State, or federal agencies. 1

2 The Town may also enter into enforcement and mutual aid agreements with county, State, and

3 federal agencies to cooperatively enforce navigation, boating, water safety, resource protection,

4 recreation, access, and public safety laws and regulations. 5

- **SECTION 5.** Additional powers. The Town of Carolina Beach may:
- 6 Hire one or more special officers to serve as harbormaster and to patrol and (1)7 enforce the laws in the Town and shoreline area. The harbormaster and other 8 officers hired under this section may exercise all the powers of a law 9 enforcement officer generally within the Town, shall be entitled to all powers, privileges, and immunities afforded by law to regularly employed 10 11 law enforcement officers of the Town, and are subject to all provisions of 12 law relating to law enforcement officers, including training requirements and 13 the requirement that an officer must take the oath of office required of a law 14 enforcement officer. 15 Own and operate facilities in the shoreline area, including: piers, docks,
- (2)slips, quays, and bulkheads; boats and water transportation; moorings and 16 17 mooring fields; boating safety equipment; dredging and channel maintenance equipment; boating access; and traffic control, navigational 18 19 devices, lighting, and signage, subject to the limitations in G.S. 75A-15 and 20 other applicable county, State, and federal laws. 21
 - **SECTION 6.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
