1	"(a2) Motorcycle Learner's Permit. – The following persons are eligible for a motorcycle		
2	learner's permit:		
3	(1) A person who is at least 16 years old but less than 18 years old and has a full		
4	provisional license issued by the Division.		
5	(2) A person who is at least 18 years old and has a license issued by the		
6	Division.		
7	To obtain a motorcycle learner's permit, an applicant shall pass a vision test, a road sign		
8	test, and a written test specified by the Division. An applicant who is less than 18 years old, or		
9	any applicant who has held a valid drivers license for less than two years, shall successfully		
0	complete the Motorcycle Safety Foundation Basic Rider Course or the North Carolina		
1	Motorcycle Safety Education Program Basic Rider Course. A motorcycle learner's permit		
2	expires 18 months six months after it is issued. issued and may be renewed for one additional		
3	six-month period. The holder of a motorcycle learner's permit may not drive a motorcycle with		
4	a passenger. The fee for a motorcycle learner's permit is the amount set in G.S. 20-7(1) for a		
5	learner's permit."		
6	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective January 1, 2010.
