10 **FIVE PERCENT REDUCTION FOR CERTAIN HIGHLY COMPENSATED**
11 **EMPLOYEES**

12 **SECTION 26.3A.1** Given that the extreme fiscal crisis affecting North Carolina's
13 economy, the national economy, and global economic markets has substantially reduced the
14 State's revenue projections for the 2009-2011 biennium and that economies in State
15 expenditures and maximized efficiencies in State operations must be effected immediately and
16 systematically in order to meet the compelling State interest of enacting a balanced budget in
17 accordance with the State Constitution and to protect the interests of the people of North
18 Carolina:

- 19 (1) The annual salaries of all employees whose salaries are set by or under this
20 Part having an annual salary of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) or
21 more shall be reduced by five percent (5%) from July 1, 2009 through June
22 30, 2011.
- 23 (2) The salary reductions required by subdivision (1) of this section, in
24 accordance with State constitutional requirements, shall not affect:
- 25 a. The annual salaries of justices and judges set by Section 26.4(a) of
26 this act.
- 27 b. The annual salaries of elected officers and officials set by Section
28 26.1 of this act.
- 29 (3) The annual salaries set by Section 26.2 and Section 26.3 of this act shall not
30 be reduced under this section because those salaries already reflect five
31 percent (5%) reductions.

32 The savings to the State generated ~~during~~ by the provisions of this section during the 2009-
33 2010 and 2010-2011 fiscal years are appropriated to the Savings Reserve Account, as
34 established by G.S. 143C-4-3.";

1 **"CLERK OF SUPERIOR COURT**

2 **SECTION 26.5.** G.S. 7A-101(a) reads as rewritten:

3 '(a) The clerk of superior court is a full-time employee of the State and shall receive an
4 annual salary, payable in equal monthly installments, based on the population of the county as
5 determined in subsection (a1) of this section, according to the following schedule:

6 Population	Annual Salary
7 Less than 100,000	\$ 82,401
8 100,000 to 149,999	92,468
9 150,000 to 249,999	102,536 97,409
10 250,000 and above	112,607 106,977.

11 When a county changes from one population group to another, the salary of the clerk shall
12 be changed, on July 1 of the fiscal year for which the change is reported, to the salary
13 appropriate for the new population group, except that the salary of an incumbent clerk shall not
14 be decreased by any change in population group during his continuance in office."";

15 and further moves to amend the bill on page 174, lines 31-34, by rewriting the lines to read:

16 **"GENERAL ASSEMBLY PRINCIPAL CLERKS/SALARY REDUCTIONS**

17 **SECTION 26.8.** G.S. 120-37(c) reads as rewritten:

18 "(c) The principal clerks shall be full-time officers. Each principal clerk shall be entitled
19 to other benefits available to permanent legislative employees and shall be paid an annual
20 salary of ~~one hundred four thousand eighty four dollars (\$104,084)~~ ninety eight thousand eight
21 hundred eighty dollars (98,880) payable monthly. Each principal clerk shall also receive such
22 additional compensation as approved by the Speaker of the House of Representatives or the
23 President Pro Tempore of the Senate, respectively, for additional employment duties beyond
24 those provided by the rules of their House. The Legislative Services Commission shall review
25 the salary of the principal clerks prior to submission of the proposed operating budget of the
26 General Assembly to the Governor and shall make appropriate recommendations for changes in
27 those salaries. Any changes enacted by the General Assembly shall be by amendment to this
28 paragraph."";
