FIVE PERCENT REDUCTION FOR CERTAIN HIGHLY COMPENSATED EMPLOYEES

SECTION 26.3A.1 Given that the extreme fiscal crisis affecting North Carolina's economy, the national economy, and global economic markets has substantially reduced the State's revenue projections for the 2009-2011 biennium and that economies in State expenditures and maximized efficiencies in State operations must be effected immediately and systematically in order to meet the compelling State interest of enacting a balanced budget in accordance with the State Constitution and to protect the interests of the people of North Carolina:

- (1) The annual salaries of all employees whose salaries are set by or under this Part having an annual salary of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) or more shall be reduced by five percent (5%) from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2011.
- (2) The salary reductions required by subdivision (1) of this section, in accordance with State constitutional requirements, shall not affect:
 - a. The annual salaries of justices and judges set by Section 26.4(a) of this act.
 - b. The annual salaries of elected officers and officials set by Section 26.1 of this act.
- (3) The annual salaries set by Section 26.2 and Section 26.3 of this act shall not be reduced under this section because those salaries already reflect five percent (5%) reductions.

The savings to the State generated during by the provisions of this section during the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 fiscal years are appropriated to the Savings Reserve Account, as established by G.S. 143C-4-3.";
