1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO ENSURE THE ACCESSIBILITY OF HANDICAPPED PARKING IN NORTH
3 CAROLINA BY REQUIRING AN EXPIRATION DATE VISIBLE FROM AT LEAST
4 TWENTY FEET ON ALL HANDICAPPED PLACARDS, TO ENSURE INCREASED
5 ENFORCEMENT AND COLLECTION OF EXPIRED OR REVOKED PLACARDS BY
6 REQUIRING THAT PLACARDS DISPLAY THE MONTH AND YEAR OF
7 EXPIRATION, TO REQUIRE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO ISSUE
8 HANDICAPPED PLACARD REGISTRATION CARDS, TO REQUIRE THAT THE
9 PERSON TO WHOM THE PLACARD IS ISSUED BE THE OPERATOR OF OR A
10 PASSENGER IN THE VEHICLE IN WHICH THE PLACARD IS DISPLAYED, AND
11 TO REQUIRE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO ISSUE A SPECIAL
12 IDENTIFICATION CARD FREE OF CHARGE TO A PERSON WHOSE VALID
13 DRIVERS LICENSE IS ADMINISTRATIVELY REVOKED DUE TO A MEDICAL
14 DISQUALIFICATION.

15 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

16 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 20-37.5(4) reads as rewritten:

17 "(4) "Removable windshield placard" means a two-sided, hooked placard which
18 includes on each side:

- 19 a. The International Symbol of Access, which is at least three inches in
20 height, centered on the placard, and is white on a blue shield;
- 21 b. An identification number;
- 22 c. An expiration ~~date; and~~ date that is visible from at least 20 feet and
23 the month and year of expiration; and
- 24 d. The seal or other identification of the issuing authority."

25 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 20-37.6(c) reads as rewritten:

26 "(c) Handicapped Drivers and Passengers; Distinguishing Placards. – A handicapped
27 person may apply for the issuance of a removable windshield placard or a temporary removable
28 windshield placard. Upon request, one additional placard may be issued to applicants who do
29 not have a distinguishing license plate. Any organization which, as determined and certified by
30 the State Vocational Rehabilitation Agency, regularly transports handicapped persons may also
31 apply. These organizations may receive one removable windshield placard for each
32 transporting vehicle. When the removable windshield or temporary removable windshield
33 placard is properly displayed, all parking rights and privileges extended to vehicles displaying a



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1 distinguishing license plate issued pursuant to subsection (b) shall apply. The removable
2 windshield placard or the temporary removable windshield placard shall be displayed so that it
3 may be viewed from the front and rear of the vehicle by hanging it from the front windshield
4 rearview mirror of a vehicle using a parking space allowed for handicapped persons. When
5 there is no inside rearview mirror, or when the placard cannot reasonably be hung from the
6 rearview mirror by the handicapped person, the placard shall be displayed on the driver's side
7 of the dashboard. A removable windshield placard placed on a motorized wheelchair or similar
8 vehicle shall be displayed in a clearly visible location. The Division shall establish procedures
9 for the issuance of the placards and may charge a fee sufficient to pay the actual cost of
10 issuance, but in no event less than five dollars (\$5.00) per placard. The Division shall issue a
11 placard registration card with each placard issued to a handicapped person. The registration
12 card shall bear the name of the person to whom the placard is issued, the person's address, the
13 placard number, and an expiration date. The registration card shall be in the vehicle in which
14 the placard is being used, and the person to whom the placard is issued shall be the operator or
15 a passenger in the vehicle in which the placard is displayed."

16 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 20-37.7(d) reads as rewritten:

17 "(d) Expiration and Fee. – A special identification card issued to a person for the first
18 time under this section expires when a drivers license issued on the same day to that person
19 would expire. A special identification card renewed under this section expires when a drivers
20 license renewed by the card holder on the same day would expire.

21 The fee for a special identification card is the same as the fee set in G.S. 20-14 for a
22 duplicate license. The fee does not apply to a special identification card issued to a resident of
23 this State who is legally blind, is at least 70 years old, ~~or is homeless~~ is homeless, or who has
24 been issued a drivers license but the drivers license is cancelled under G.S. 20-15, in
25 accordance with G.S. 20-9(e) and (g), as a result of a physical or mental disability or disease.
26 To obtain a special identification card without paying a fee, a homeless person must present a
27 letter to the Division from the director of a facility that provides care or shelter to homeless
28 persons verifying that the person is homeless."

29 **SECTION 4.** Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective January 1, 2010. The
30 remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
