1	A city or county may adopt an ordinance governing characteristically wild animals that is
2	more restrictive than this Chapter. However, nothing in this Chapter requires a city or county to
3	adopt an ordinance to be in compliance with this Chapter.
4	" <u>§ 19B-6. Enforcement of Chapter.</u>
5	(a) The animal control authority and its staff and agents, local law enforcement agents,
6	and county sheriffs are authorized and empowered to enforce the provisions of this Chapter.
7	(b) The possessor of a characteristically wild animal shall, at all reasonable times, allow
8	the animal control authority or other persons designated by this Chapter to enter the premises
9	where the animal is being kept to ensure compliance with this Chapter.
10	" <u>§ 19B-7. Penalties.</u>
11	A person who violates this Chapter is liable for a civil penalty to be determined by the
12	<u>court.</u>
13	" <u>§ 19B-8. Severability.</u>
14	If any part of this Chapter is determined to be unconstitutional or unenforceable, it shall not
15	affect the constitutionality or enforceability of any other part."
16	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective January 1, 2010, and applies to acts
17	committed on or after that date.
