9	"(a1) It shall be permissible for pyrotechnics to be exhibited, used, handled,
10	manufactured, or discharged within the State, provided all of the following apply:
11	(1) The exhibition, use, or discharge is at a concert or public exhibition.
12	(2) All individuals who exhibit, use, handle, or discharge pyrotechnics in
13	connection with a concert or public exhibition have completed the training
14	and licensing required under G.S. 58-82A-2 and are under the direct
15	supervision and control of a display operator who holds a display operator
16	permit issued by the State Fire Marshal under G.S. 58-82A-3. Article 82A of
17	Chapter 58 of the General Statutes. The display operator or proximate
18	audience display operator, as required under Article 82A of Chapter 58 of
19	the General Statutes, must be present at the concert or public exhibition and
20	must personally direct all aspects of exhibiting, using, handling, or
21	discharging the pyrotechnics.
22	(3) The display operator has secured written authority under G.S. 14-413 from
23	the board of county commissioners of the county, or the city if authorized

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1 **SECTION 10.** Sections 9, 9.1, and 10 of this act are effective when they become 2 law. The remainder of this act becomes effective October 1, 2010.
