6	SECTION 1. G.S. 120-182 reads as rewritten:		
7	"§ 120-182. Commission; membership.		
8	The Commission shall consist of 17 members, as follows:		
9	(1)	The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services or the	
10		<u>Secretary's</u> delegate shall serve ex officio as a non-voting member;	
11	(2)	Eight shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives,	
12		five being members of the House of Representatives at the time of their	
13		appointment, and at least two being planners for or providers of health,	
14		mental health, or social services to older adults; and	
15	(3)	Eight shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, five	
16		being members of the Senate at the time of their appointment, and at least	
17		two being planners for or providers of health, mental health, or social	
18		services to older adults.	
19	Any vacancy shall be filled by the appointing authority who made the initial appointment		
20	and by a person having the same qualifications. All initial appointments shall be made within		
21	one calendar month from the effective date of this Article. Members' terms shall last for two		
22	years. Members may be reappointed for two consecutive terms Members may be appointed to a		
23	maximum of three consecutive terms and may be appointed again after having been off the		
24	Commission for two years." SECTION 2. G.S. 120-217 reads as rewritten:
