A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- AN ACT TO ENSURE THAT THE GUIDELINES FOR INDIVIDUAL DIABETES CARE PLANS ADOPTED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION ARE IMPLEMENTED IN CHARTER SCHOOLS.
- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-238.29F(a) reads as rewritten:

7 "(a) Health and Safety Standards. – A charter school shall meet the same health and 8 safety requirements required of a local school administrative unit. The Department of Public 9 Instruction shall ensure that charter schools provide parents and guardians with information 10 about meningococcal meningitis and influenza and their vaccines at the beginning of every 11 school year. This information shall include the causes, symptoms, and how meningococcal 12 meningitis and influenza are spread and the places where parents and guardians may obtain 13 additional information and vaccinations for their children.

14 The Department of Public Instruction shall also ensure that charter schools provide parents 15 and guardians with information about cervical cancer, cervical dysplasia, human papillomavirus, and the vaccines available to prevent these diseases. This information shall be 16 17 provided at the beginning of the school year to parents of children entering grades five though 18 12. This information shall include the causes and symptoms of these diseases, how they are 19 transmitted, how they may be prevented by vaccination, including the benefits and possible 20 side effects of vaccination, and the places where parents and guardians may obtain additional 21 information and vaccinations for their children.

The Department of Public Instruction shall also ensure that charter schools provide students in grades nine through 12 with information annually on the manner in which a parent may lawfully abandon a newborn baby with a responsible person, in accordance with G.S. 7B-500.

The Department of Public Instruction also shall ensure that the guidelines for individual diabetes care plans adopted by the State Board of Education under G.S. 115C-12(31) are implemented in charter schools in which students with diabetes are enrolled and that charter schools otherwise comply with the provisions of G.S. 115C-373."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with
the 2009-2010 school year.
