"" **SECTION 15.1.** G.S. 105-159.1(a) reads as rewritten:

Every individual whose income tax liability for the taxable year is three dollars (\$3.00) or more may designate on his or her income tax return that three dollars (\$3.00) of the tax shall be credited to the North Carolina Political Parties Financing Fund for the use of the political party designated by the taxpayer. In the case of a married couple filing a joint return whose income tax liability for the taxable year is six dollars (\$6.00) or more, each spouse may designate on the income tax return that three dollars (\$3.00) of the tax shall be credited to the North Carolina Political Parties Financing Fund for the use of the political party designated by the taxpayer. Amounts credited to the Fund shall be allocated among the political parties according to the designation of the taxpayer. Where any taxpayer elects to designate but does not specify a particular political party, those funds shall be distributed among the political parties on a pro rata basis according to their respective party voter registrations as determined by the most recent certification of the State Board of Elections. The choices given to the taxpayer on the return shall include, in addition to the choices of designating to the parties and the choice of designating to the Fund without specifying party, the choice of not designating at all. The Secretary shall design the form in such a way that a taxpayer does not mistake a choice to designate without specifying a party for a choice not to designate at all. As used in this section, the term "political party" means one of the following that has at least one percent (1%) of the total number of registered voters in the State:

(1) A political party that at the last preceding general State election received at least ten percent (10%) of the entire vote cast in the State for Governor or for presidential electors.
