1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED			
2 3	AN ACT AUTHORIZING A JOINT LEGISLATIVE STUDY COMMISSION ON YOUTH TRANSITIONING OUT OF FOSTER CARE.			
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
5	SECTION 1.(a) There is created the Joint Legislative Study Commission on Youth			
6 7	Transitioning Out of Foster Care. The Commission shall consist of 12 members appointed as follows:			
8	(1) Six members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, to			
9	include:			
10	a. Four members of the House of Representatives.			
11	b. Two members of the general public, one of whom is a youth who has			
12	aged out of foster care.			
13	(2) Six members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, to			
14	include:			
15	a. Four members of the Senate.			
16	b. Two members of the general public, one of whom is a person who			
17	provides transitional living services to youths aging out of foster			
18	care.			
19	The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the			
20	Senate shall each appoint a cochair for the Commission. Vacancies on the Commission shall be			
21	filled by the same appointing authority who made the initial appointment. The Commission			
22	may meet at any time upon the joint call of the cochairs. The Commission may meet in the			
23	Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building. The Commission may contract for			
24	consultant services as provided by G.S. 120-32.02.			
25	SECTION 1.(b) The Commission, while in the discharge of its official duties, may			
26	exercise all powers provided for under G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4,			
27	including the power to request all officers, agents, agencies, and departments of the State to			
28	provide any information, data, or documents within their possession, ascertainable from their			
29	records, or otherwise available to them and the power to subpoen a witnesses.			
30 31	SECTION 1.(c) The Legislative Services Commission, through the Legislative			
32	Services Officer, shall assign professional staff to assist the Commission in its work. The House of Representatives and Senate's Directors of Legislative Assistants shall assign clerical			
33	staff to the Commission, and the expenses relating to the clerical employees shall be borne by			
55	start to the commission, and the expenses relating to the elefter employees shall be bollie by			



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1	the Commission. Members of the Commission shall receive subsistence and travel expenses at			
2	the rates set forth in G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate.			
3	SECTION 2. The Commission shall study the needs of youth transitioning out of			
4	the foster care system. In conducting the study, the Commission shall consider issues related to			
5	the following:			
6	(1)	The challenges facing youth transitioning out of foster care	e, particularly in	
7		the areas of education, housing, health care, and employme	nt, as compared	
8		to youth not in foster care.		
9	(2)	The impact on youth transitioning out of foster care when is	ssues relating to	
10		education, housing, health care, and employment are	not addressed,	
11		including incarceration, substance abuse, pregnancy, vic	timization, and	
12		homelessness.		
13	(3)	Whether data or statistics are available regarding youth tran	nsitioning out of	
14		foster care in this State.		
15	(4)	The State's current laws and policies regarding youth in foste	r care.	
16	(5)	What, if any, programs exist in this State to address the	issue of youth	
17		transitioning out of foster care and an assessment of the	e shortfalls and	
18		benefits of such programs.		
19	(6)	Legislation adopted or programs established by other states	regarding youth	
20		transitioning out of foster care.		
21	(7)	The appropriate age to which assistance should be exte	nded for youth	
22		transitioning out of foster care.		
23	(8)	How foster care is currently funded and what funding s	sources may be	
24		available for youth transitioning out of foster care.		
25	(9)	Any other matter the Commission deems relevant to the study	у.	
26	SECTION 3. The Commission shall report its findings, recommendations, and			
27	legislative proposals to the 2010 Regular Session of the 2009 General Assembly on or before			
28	June 1, 2010. The Commission shall terminate upon filing its final report.			
29	SEC	FION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
