1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE STATE BOARD OF COMMUNITY COLLEGES TO
3 WAIVE TUITION FOR MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL GUARD.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 115D-5(b) reads as rewritten:

6 "(b) In order to make instruction as accessible as possible to all citizens, the teaching of
7 curricular courses and of noncurricular extension courses at convenient locations away from
8 institution campuses as well as on campuses is authorized and shall be encouraged.

9 (1) A pro rata portion of the established regular tuition rate charged a full-time
10 student shall be charged a part-time student taking any curriculum course.

11 (2) In lieu of any tuition charge, the State Board of Community Colleges shall
12 establish a uniform registration fee, or a schedule of uniform registration
13 fees, to be charged students enrolling in extension courses for which
14 instruction is financed primarily from State funds; provided, however, that
15 the State Board of Community Colleges may provide by general and
16 uniform regulations for waiver of tuition and registration fees for ~~persons~~
17 persons who are:

18 a. ~~not~~ Not enrolled in elementary or secondary schools taking courses
19 leading to a high school diploma or equivalent certificate,

20 b. ~~for~~ Taking training courses for volunteer firemen, local fire
21 department personnel, volunteer rescue and lifesaving department
22 personnel, local rescue and lifesaving department personnel,

23 c. Radio Emergency Associated Citizens Team (REACT) members
24 when the REACT team is under contract to a county as an emergency
25 response agency,

26 d. ~~local~~ Local law-enforcement officers,

27 e. ~~patients~~ Patients in State alcoholic rehabilitation centers,

28 f. ~~all full-time~~ Full-time custodial employees of the Department of
29 Correction, employees of the Department's Division of Community
30 Corrections and employees of the Department of Juvenile Justice and
31 Delinquency Prevention required to be certified under Chapter 17C
32 of the General Statutes and the rules of the Criminal Justice and
33 Training Standards Commission,

2 Expanding Industry Program,
3 h. ~~clients~~ Clients of sheltered workshops,
4 i. ~~clients~~ Clients of adult developmental activity programs,
5 j. ~~students~~ Students in Health and Human Services Development
6 Programs,
7 k. ~~juveniles~~ Juveniles of any age committed to the Department of
8 Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention by a court of competent
9 jurisdiction,

11 m. Members of the North Carolina National Guard as defined in
12 G.S. 127A-3 and as administered under Article 3 of Chapter 127A of

19 courses in first aid or cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).
20 (3) ~~Provided further, tuition~~ Tuition shall be waived for senior citizens attending
21 institutions operating under this Chapter as set forth in Chapter 115B of the
22 General Statutes, Tuition Waiver for Senior Citizens.
23 (4) ~~Provided further, tuition~~ Tuition shall also be waived for all courses taken by
24 high school students at community colleges, including students in early
25 college and middle college high school programs, in accordance with
26 G.S. 115D-20(4) and this section."

27 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective January 1, 2010.
