5	The Secretary shall not list a registered polysomnographic technologist until the registered
6	polysomnographic technologist has presented to the Secretary a copy of the registered
7	polysomnographic technologist's Board-credentialing document or has arranged for the Board
8	to electronically notify the Secretary of the registered polysomnographic technologist's
9	credentials and the Secretary has received notice from the Board. The Secretary shall develop a
0	form for applicants seeking to file as registered polysomnographic technologists and may
1	require that filing be made by electronic filing and electronic fee payment. A filing with the
2	Secretary is void if a check or other payment of a required fee is returned to the Secretary by
3	the issuing institution for insufficient funds or other similar reason.
4	(b) The Secretary shall maintain a listing of all current registered polysomnographic
5	technologists. All fees paid to the Secretary shall be used to pay the costs incurred in
6	administering and enforcing this Article. The Board shall promptly notify the Secretary, by
7	mail or electronic means, when a person's credential is revoked or no longer in effect. If the
8	Secretary is notified that a registrant's credential is revoked or no longer in effect, the Secretary
9	shall promptly amend the listing in accordance with the Board's notice.
0	(c) <u>A listing automatically expires on the 30^{th} day of September of each year. A listing</u>
1	shall be renewed annually upon the filing of a new listing form, credential verification, and
2	filing fee."
3	SECTION 2. No later than six months from the effective date of this act, the North
4	Carolina Medical Board shall identify the standards of physician supervision of persons
5	registered to practice as registered polysomnographic technologists under Article 39A of
6	Chapter 90 of the General Statutes, as enacted in Section 1 of this act. The North Carolina
7	Medical Board shall communicate the standards of supervision to all physicians licensed to
8	practice medicine under Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes.
9	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2009.
