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HOUSE BILL 952 PROPOSED COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE H952-PCS80344-RQ-14

Short Title: Study Merit-Based Components/Teacher Salary. (Public) Sponsors: Referred to: April 1, 2009 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE LEGISLATIVE STUDY COMMITTEE ON TEACHER COMPENSATION. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** There is created the Legislative Study Committee on Teacher Compensation. **SECTION 2.** The Committee shall consist of: Five members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, two of which must be of the minority party; Five members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the (2) Senate, two of which must be of the minority party; Two representatives of the North Carolina Association of Educators, Inc., (3) appointed by that organization; One representative of the North Carolina School Boards Association, (4) appointed by that organization; One representative of the Public School Forum of North Carolina, appointed (5) by that organization; and One representative of the North Carolina Association of School (6) Administrators, appointed by that organization. **SECTION 3.** The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate one representative as cochair, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall designate one senator as cochair. Vacancies on the Committee shall be filled by the same appointing authority that made the initial appointment. A quorum of the Committee shall be a majority of its members. **SECTION 4.** The Committee shall study the current teacher compensation system in North Carolina and shall consider whether the system should include additional merit-based components. **SECTION 5.** Members of the Committee shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowances in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate. Committee, while in the discharge of its official duties, may exercise all powers provided for under G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4. The Committee may meet at any time upon the joint call of the cochairs. The Committee may meet in the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building.

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With approval of the Legislative Services Commission, the Legislative Services
Officer shall assign professional staff to assist the Committee in its work. The House of
Representatives' and the Senate's Directors of Legislative Assistants shall assign clerical staff to
the Committee, and the expenses relating to the clerical employees shall be borne by the
Committee. The Committee may contract for professional, clerical, or consultant services as
provided by G.S. 120-32.02. If the Committee hires a consultant, the consultant shall not be a
State employee or a person currently under contract with the State to provide services.

All State departments and agencies and local governments and their subdivisions shall furnish the Committee with any information in their possession or available to them.

SECTION 6. The Committee shall report the results of its study and its recommendations to the 2010 Regular Session of the 2009 General Assembly. The Committee shall terminate on May 1, 2010, or upon the filing of its final report, whichever occurs first.

SECTION 7. This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.
