4 (c) The Authority may use up to one and one-half percent (1.5%) of the funds 5 transferred in accordance with Chapter 18C of the General Statutes for administrative purposes.

6 (d) Scholarship funds unexpended shall remain available for future scholarships to be 7 awarded under this Article.

8 (e) The State Education Assistance Authority shall report annually to the Joint 9 Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations regarding the use of the funds allocated 10 to the Authority under S.L. 2005-344."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law. The first scholarships shall
 be awarded pursuant to this act for the 2010-2011 academic year.
