7	(b) Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of cyber-bullying, which			
8	offense shall be punishable as a Class 1 misdemeanor if the defendant is 18 years of age or			
9	older at the time the offense is committed. If the defendant is under the age of 18 at the time the			
10	offense is committed, the offense shall be punishable as a Class 2 misdemeanor.			
11	(c) Whenever any person pleads guilty to or is guilty of an offense under this section,			
12	and the offense was committed before the person attained the age of 18 years, the court may,			
13	without entering a judgment of guilt and with the consent of the defendant, defer further			
14	proceedings and place the defendant on probation upon such reasonable terms and conditions			
15	as the court may require. Upon fulfillment of the terms and conditions of the probation			
16	provided for in this subsection, the court shall discharge the defendant and dismiss the			
17	proceedings against the defendant. Discharge and dismissal under this subsection shall be			
18	without court adjudication of guilt and shall not be deemed a conviction for purposes of this			
19	section or for purposes of disqualifications or disabilities imposed by law upon conviction of a			
20	crime. Upon discharge and dismissal pursuant to this subsection, the person may apply for an			
21	order to expunge the complete record of the proceedings resulting in the dismissal and			
22	discharge, pursuant to the procedures and requirements set forth in G.S. 15A-146."			
23	SECTION 2. G.S. 14-453 is amended by adding two new subdivisions to read:			
24	"(7b) <u>'Internet chat room' means a computer service allowing two or more users to</u>			
25	<u>communicate with each other in real time.</u>			
26 27	(7c) 'Profile' means a configuration of user data required by a computer so that			
	the user may access programs or services and have the desired functionality			
28 29	on that computer." SECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2009, and applies to
