(a) T	The Director shall recommend to the Commission those pe	ersons with whom to
contract as lottery game retailers. To the extent practicable, the Director shall meet the minority		
participation	n goals under Article 8 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes.	
(b) T	The Director may not recommend contracting with any of the f	following:
((1) A natural person under 21 years of age. This minimum	age shall not prohibit
	employees of a lottery game retailer who are under 2	21 years of age from
	selling lottery tickets or shares during their employment	t.
((2) A person who would be engaged exclusively in the	e business of selling
	lottery tickets or shares or operating electronic compu	ter terminals or other
	devices solely for entertainment.	
((3) A person who is not current in filing all applicable ta	x returns to the State
	and in payment of all taxes, interest, and penalties	s owed to the State,
	excluding items under formal appeal under applicable s	statutes. Upon request
	of the Director, the Department of Revenue shall pro	vide this information
	about a specific person to the Commission.	
((4) A person who resides in the same household as	s a member of the
	Commission, the Director, or any other employee of the	e Commission.
<u>(</u>	(5) A person who would have, other than lottery sales, the	ne cashing of checks,
	drafts, or money orders as the majority of net revenue.	-
(c) U	Upon approval of the Commission, the Director shall enter in	to a contract with the
person to sell tickets or shares upon such terms and conditions as the Commission directs."
