	the public may conduct a search of the system for a registrant under any of those names."
	<b>SECTION 8.</b> G.S. 101-5 reads as rewritten:
	"§ 101-5. Clerk to order change; certificate and record.
)	If Except as prohibited by G.S. 101-6(c), if the clerk thinks that good and sufficient reason
	exists for the change of name, it shall be his duty to issue an order changing the name of the
	applicant from his true name to the name sought to be adopted. Such order shall contain the
	true name, the county of birth, the date of birth, the full name of parents as shown on birth
	certificate, and the name sought to be adopted. He shall issue to the applicant a certificate under
	his hand and seal of office, stating the change made in the applicant's name, and shall also
	record said application and order on the docket of special proceedings in his court. He shall
	forward the order to the State Registrar of Vital Statistics on a form provided by him. If the
	applicant was born in North Carolina, the State Registrar shall note the change of name of the
	individual or individuals specified in the order on the birth certificate of that individual or those

	<b>SECTION 9.</b> Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 of this act become effective December 1,
•	2011, and apply to persons whose initial registration under Article 27A of Chapter 14 of the
	General Statutes occurs on or after December 1, 2011, and to persons who are registered under
	Article 27 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes prior to December 1, 2011, and continue to be
	registered on December 1, 2011. However, any person registered under Article 27 of Chapter
	14 of the General Statutes prior to December 1, 2011, and continuing to be registered or
	December 1, 2011, shall not be in violation of the registration, verification, and reporting
	requirements regarding a person's name, if the person provides the required information at the
	first verification of information that occurs on or after December 1, 2011. Section 5 of this ac
	becomes effective December 1, 2011, and applies to petitions filed on or after that date. Section
	8 of this act is effective when it becomes law and applies to petitions filed or pending on or after that date. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
