**SECTION 3.** G.S. 14-288.9(c) reads as rewritten:

11 12 13 "(c) Any person who commits an assault <u>causing physical injury</u> upon emergency personnel is guilty of a <u>Class 1 misdemeanor.Class I felony.</u> Any person who commits an assault upon emergency personnel with or through the use of any dangerous weapon or substance shall be punished as a Class F felon."

**SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2011, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date. Prosecutions for offenses committed before the effective date of this act are not abated or affected by this act, and the statutes that would be applicable but for this act remain applicable to those prosecutions.
