11 SECTION 1.1. Part 26 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes, G.S. 143B-128, is
12 repealed.

Money may be appropriated from the Information Technology Fund to meet statewide requirements, including planning, project management, security, electronic mail, State portal operations, and the administration of systemwide procurement procedures. Expenditures involving funds appropriated to the Office of Information Technology Services from the Information Technology Fund shall be made by the ~~State CIO in consultation with the Information Technology Advisory Board.~~CIO. By October 1 of each year, the State CIO shall submit to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Information Technology a report on all expenditures involving funds appropriated to the Office of Information Technology Services from the Information Technology Fund for the preceding fiscal year. Interest earnings on the Information Technology Fund balance shall be credited to the Information Technology Fund."

4 information technology security to maximize the functionality, security, and interoperability of

6 technologies. The State CIO shall review and revise the security standards annually. As part of
7 this function, the State Chief Information Officer shall review periodically existing security
8 standards and practices in place among the various State agencies to determine whether those
9 standards and practices meet statewide security and encryption requirements. The State Chief
10 Information Officer may assume the direct responsibility of providing for the information
11 technology security of any State agency that fails to adhere to security standards adopted under
12 this Article. ~~Any actions taken by the State Chief Information Officer under this section shall~~
13 ~~be reported to the Information Technology Advisory Board at its next scheduled meeting."~~

42 Board of Public Telecommunications Commissioners, composed of ~~27-26~~ members as follows:

- 43 (1) A Chairman appointed by, and serving at the pleasure of, the Governor;
- 44 (2) Ten at-large members, appointed by the Governor from the general public;
- 45 (3) Two members appointed by the General Assembly upon the
46 recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives in
47 accordance with G.S. 120-121;
- 48 (4) Two members appointed by the General Assembly upon the
49 recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate in accordance
50 with G.S. 120-121;
- 51 (5) The Secretary of Administration, ex officio;

- 1 (6) The Chairman of the Board of Trustees of The University of North Carolina
- 2 Center for Public Television (if and when established), ex officio;
- 3 (7) The Chairman of the State Board of Education, ex officio;
- 4 (8) The Chairman of the OPEN/net Committee, ex officio, so long as such
- 5 person is not a State employee;
- 6 (9) The Chairman of the North Carolina Utilities Commission, ex officio;
- 7 (10) The Director of the Public Staff of the North Carolina Utilities Commission,
- 8 ex officio;
- 9 ~~(11) The Chairman of the Public Radio Advisory Committee of the North~~
- 10 ~~Carolina Agency for Public Telecommunications, ex officio;~~
- 11 (12) The Superintendent of Public Instruction, ex officio;
- 12 (13) The President of the University of North Carolina, ex officio;
- 13 (14) The President of the Community Colleges System, ex officio; and
- 14 (15) Two members ex officio who shall rotate from among the remaining heads
- 15 of departments enumerated in G.S. 143A-11 or G.S. 143B-6, appointed by
- 16 the Governor.

17 The 10 at-large members shall serve for terms staggered as follows: four terms shall expire
18 on June 30, 1980; and three terms shall expire on June 30, 1982; and three terms shall expire on
19 June 30, 1984. Thereafter, the members at large shall be appointed for full four-year terms and
20 until their successors are appointed and qualified. In making appointments of members at large,
21 the Governor shall seek to appoint persons from the various geographic areas of the State
22 including both urban and rural areas; persons from various classifications as to sex, race, age,
23 and handicapped persons; and persons who are representatives of the public broadcast,
24 commercial broadcast, nonbroadcast distributive systems and private education communities of
25 the State.

26 The terms of the ex officio members are coterminous with their respective terms of office.
27 In the event that any of the offices represented on the Board ceases to exist, the successor
28 officer to the designated member shall become an ex officio member of the Board; if there shall
29 be no successor, then the position on the Board shall be filled by a member to be appointed by
30 the Governor from the general public. The ex officio members shall have the right to vote.

31 The initial members appointed to the Board by the General Assembly shall serve for terms
32 expiring June 30, 1983. Thereafter, their successors shall serve for two-year terms beginning
33 July 1 of odd-numbered years.

34 The terms of the rotating ex officio members shall be of one-year duration, and the schedule
35 of rotation is determined by the Governor.

36 Each State official who serves on the Board may designate a representative of his
37 department, agency or institution to sit in his place on the Board and to exercise fully the
38 official's privileges of membership.

39 The Secretary of Administration or his designee serves as secretary of the Board.

40 Vacancies in appointments made by the General Assembly shall be filled in accordance
41 with G.S. 120-122. Other vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original
42 appointment.

43 The Governor may remove any member of the Board from office in accordance with the
44 provisions of G.S. 143B-16.

45 The Board meets quarterly and at other times at the call of the chairman or upon written
46 request of at least six members.

47 A majority of the Board members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business."

- 27 3. Enlarging, expanding, and extending; and
- 28 4. Demolishing, relocating, improving, grading, draining,
29 landscaping, paving, widening, and resurfacing.
- 30 b. The costs of all property, both real and personal and both improved
31 and unimproved, and of plants, works, appurtenances, structures,
32 facilities, furnishings, machinery, equipment, vehicles, easements,
33 water rights, air rights, franchises, and licenses used or useful in
34 connection with the purpose authorized;
- 35 c. The costs of demolishing or moving structures from land acquired
36 and acquiring any lands to which such structures thereafter are to be
37 moved;
- 38 d. Financing charges, including estimated interest during the acquisition
39 or construction of such project and for six months thereafter;
- 40 e. The costs of services to provide and the cost of plans, specifications,
41 studies and reports, surveys, and estimates of costs and revenues;
- 42 f. The costs of paying any interim financing, including principal,
43 interest, and premium, related to the acquisition or construction of a
44 project;
- 45 g. Administrative and legal expenses and administrative charges;
- 46 h. The costs of obtaining bond and reserve fund insurance and
47 investment contracts, of credit-enhancement facilities, liquidity
48 facilities and interest-rate agreements, and of establishing and
49 maintaining debt service and other reserves; and
- 50 i. Any other services, costs, and expenses necessary or incidental to the
51 purpose authorized.

- 29 c. Investment earnings on all revenues, funds, and other moneys of the
