2	AN ACT TO EXTEND THE SURVIVOR'S ALTERNATE BENEFIT TO SURVIVORS OF			
3	FIREFIGHTERS AND RESCUE SQUAD WORKERS WHO ARE MEMBERS OF THE			
4	LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND ARE			
5	KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.			
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
7	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 128-21 is amended by adding two new subdivisions to read:			
8	"(7b) "Firefighter" means a person (i) who is a full-time paid employee of an			
9	employer that participates in the Local Governmental Employees'			
10	Retirement System and maintains a fire department certified by the North			
11	Carolina Department of Insurance and (ii) who is actively serving in a			
12	position with assigned primary duties and responsibilities for the prevention,			
13	detection, and suppression of fire.			
14	(7c) "Rescue squad worker" means a person (i) who is a full-time paid employee			
15	of an employer that participates in the Local Governmental Employees'			
16	Retirement System and maintains a rescue squad or emergency medical			
17	services team certified by the North Carolina Department of Insurance or the			
18	Department of Health and Human Services and (ii) who is actively serving			
19	in a position with assigned primary duties and responsibilities for the			
20	alleviation of human suffering and assistance to persons who are in			
21 22	difficulty, who are injured, or who become suddenly ill, by providing proper			
22 23	and efficient care or emergency medical services." SECTION 2. G.S. 128-27(m) reads as rewritten:

26	elect to receive in lieu thereof the reduced retirement allowance provided by Option two of

30 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2011, and applies to beneficiaries 31 of firefighters and rescue squad workers killed in the line of duty on or after that date.
