| A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO ADD MEPHEDRONE, METHYENEDIOXYPROVALERONE AND CERTAIN DERIVITIVES OF 2-AMINO-1-PHENYL-1-PROPANONE TO THE LIST OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.  The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  SECTION 1. G.S. 90-89(5) reads as rewritten:  "§ 90-89. Schedule I controlled substances.  This schedule includes the controlled substances listed or to be listed by whatever official name, common or usual name, chemical name, or trade name designated. In determining that a substance comes within this schedule, the Commission shall find: a high potential for abuse, no currently accepted medical use in the United States, or a lack of accepted safety for use in treatment under medical supervision.
