12	pursuant to G.S. 115C-238.56C shall be the finance agent for the Board and shall have all the

14	directors, including all the rights, duties, and obligations specified in Article 31 of this Chapter,
15	which powers shall be exercised by the identified local school administrative unit for and on
16	behalf of the board of directors. The board of directors shall provide reasonable compensation
17	to the local school administrative unit for this service.
18	(b) No later than 10 days after the money is appropriated to the local current expense
19	fund, each local board of education of a participating unit shall transfer to the board of directors

33 34	(a) As used in this section:
35	(1) <u>'Criminal history' means a county, state, or federal criminal history of</u>
35 36	conviction of a crime, whether a misdemeanor or a felony, that indicates an
30 37	individual (i) poses a threat to the physical safety of students or personnel or
38	(ii) has demonstrated that he or she does not have the integrity or honesty to
38 39	fulfill his or her duties as school personnel. These crimes include the
40	following North Carolina crimes contained in any of the following Articles

21 22	circumstances school personnel shall be required to be checked for a criminal history. The
22	board of directors shall apply its policy uniformly in requiring school personnel to be checked
23 24	for a criminal history. The board of directors may grant conditional approval of an application while the board of directors is checking a person's criminal history and making a decision based
24 25	on the results of the check.
25 26	<u>The board of directors shall not require school personnel to pay for the criminal history</u>
27	record check authorized under this section.
28	(c) The board of directors shall require the person to be checked by the Department of
29	Justice (i) to be fingerprinted and to provide any additional information required by the
30	Department of Justice to a person designated by the board of directors or to the local sheriff or
31	the municipal police, whichever is more convenient for the person, and (ii) to sign a form
32	consenting to the check of the criminal record and to the use of fingerprints and other
33	identifying information required by the repositories. The board of directors shall consider
34	refusal to consent when making employment decisions and decisions with regard to
35	independent contractors. The fingerprints of the individual shall be forwarded to the State
36	Bureau of Investigation for a search of the State criminal history record file, and the State

The immunity 16 17 established by this subsection shall not extend to gross negligence, wanton conduct, or intentional wrongdoing that would otherwise be actionable.
