Senator Stein

moves to amend the bill on page 1, line 7 by inserting the following between the words "SCHOOL;" and "AND":

"AND BY DIRECTING THE COMMISSION TO ESTABLISH CRITERIA FOR THE TERMINATION OR NON-RENEWAL OF A CHARTER;",

And on page 6, lines 20-21 by inserting the following between the lines:

"(a1) The Commission shall establish measurable standards by which it will evaluate (i) the quality of an applicant's mission, (ii) its educational, financial, administrative, and governance plans, and (ii) the capability of the applicant's governing board and management team to execute those plans.


(a2) In reviewing applications, the Commission shall give priority in the granting of charters to applications from applicants proposing to (i) serve the students attending a charter school that has had its charter terminated or not renewed by the Commission under G.S. 115C-238.29G and have responded to a request for proposals to replace the school's board of directors and administration; (ii) replicate a proven charter school program which is a program used at a charter school in the top twenty percent (20%) of all North Carolina public schools, as measured by the performance composite and academic growth measures compiled by the State Board; and (iii) serve students attending low-performing schools as defined by State Board of Education policy."; and

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1	On page 6, line 43, by rewriting that line to read:

5	chartering entity must meet to earn charter renewal and the type of objective and verifiable data
6	the Commission will review to evaluate performance. At a minimum, those standards shall
7	include:
8	(1) Measures of student academic achievement status or proficiency.
9	(2) Student academic growth, including adequacy of growth toward state
10	standards.
11	(4) Achievement gaps between major student subgroups.
12	(4) Post-secondary readiness and success for high schools.
13	(5) Student engagement, including attendance and recurrent enrollment from
14	year to year.
15	(6) <u>Financial performance and sustainability.</u>
16	(7) Board performance and stewardship, including compliance with all
17	applicable laws, regulations, and terms of the charter contract.

20	On page 12, line 46, through page 13, line 6, by rewriting the lines to read:

22	"(a) The State Board of Education, or a chartering entity subject to the approval of the
23	State Board of Education, Commission may terminate or not renew a charter upon any of the
24	following grounds:
25	(1) Failure to meet the requirements for student performance contained in the
26	charter;
27	(2) Failure to meet generally accepted standards of fiscal management;
28	(3) Violations of law;
29	(4) Material violation of any of the conditions, standards, or procedures set forth
30	in the charter;
31	(5) Two-thirds of the faculty and instructional support personnel at the school
32	request that the charter be terminated or not renewed; or
33	(6) Other good cause identified.
34	In addition, the Commission shall establish objective and verifiable criteria for the
35	termination or non-renewal of a charter for inadequate academic performance based on student
36	performance as measured by student academic achievement status or proficiency; student
37	academic growth, including adequacy of growth toward state standards; achievement gaps
38	between major student subgroups; post-secondary readiness and success for high schools; and
39	student engagement, including attendance and recurrent enrollment from year to year. The
40	Commission shall collect and analyze the data over a period of time to determine charter school
41	compliance with this criteria. If a charter school meets the criteria for termination or
42	non-renewal, the Commission shall provide for an emergency review of the charter school and
43	determine whether the charter shall be terminated or not renewed. If the Commission

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1 2	determines that charter shall not be terminated or shall be renewed, then the charter school shall submit an emergency plan that must be approved by the Commission to improve the academic
3	performance of the students at the charter school. If the Commission determines that the charter
4	shall be terminated or not renewed, then the Commission shall create a transition plan, secure
5	student records, and issue a request for proposals to replace the school's board of directors and
6	administration.".
