6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
7	SECTION 1. Article 22A of Chapter 163 of the General Statutes is amended by				
8	adding a new section to read:				
9	"§ 163-278.13D. Limitation on contributions from State vendors.				
10	(a) No vendor of this State may make a contribution greater than five hundred dollars				
11	(\$500.00) per election to a candidate as defined in G.S. 163-278.38Z(2) or candidate campaign				
12	committee as defined in G.S. 163-278.38Z(3) for a public servant as defined in				
13	G.S. 138A-3(30)a. and G.S. 120C-104 if the public servant has authority over the contract with				
14	the vendor.				
15	(b) This section shall not apply to a vendor who has filed a notice of candidacy for				
16	office under G.S. 163-106, G.S. 163-107.1, or Article 11 of Chapter 163 of the General Statutes				
17	or has been nominated under G.S. 163-114 or G.S. 163-98 and is making a contribution to that				
18	vendor's candidate campaign committee.

9	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective January 1, 2012, and applies to		
10	contributions made on or after that date.
