SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Justice the sum of sixty-nine thousand nine hundred thirty-four dollars (\$69,934) for fiscal year 2012-2013 to be allocated to the State Bureau of Investigation for testing and analysis of the DNA samples required by this act.

SECTION 3. The State Crime Laboratory shall seek the accreditation required by G.S. 8-58.20 and G.S. 20-139.1 from a single accrediting body. No State funds shall be spent for fiscal year 2011-2012 or fiscal year 2012-2013 to obtain a second accreditation of the State Crime Laboratory that is duplicative or unnecessary.

SECTION 4. Section 1 of this act becomes effective December 1, 2012, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date. Section 2 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2012. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
