Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new 11 Article to read: 12 "Article 1J. 13 "Voluntary Health Care Services Act. 14 "§ 90-21.100. Short title. This Article shall be known and may be cited as the Volunteer Health Care Services Act. 15 "§ 90-21.101. Findings. 16 17 The General Assem<u>bly makes the following findings:</u> (a) 18 Access to high-quality health care services is a concern of all persons. (1)Access to high-quality health care services may be limited for some 19 (2) 20 residents of this State, particularly those who reside in remote, rural areas or 21 in the inner city. 22 Physicians and other health care providers have traditionally worked to (3) ensure broad access to health care services. 23 Many health care providers from North Carolina and elsewhere are willing 24 (4) 25 to volunteer their services to address the health care needs of North 26 Carolinians who may otherwise not be able to obtain high-quality health care 27 services. The General Assembly further finds that it is the public policy of this State to 28 (b) encourage and facilitate the voluntary provision of health care services. 29 "§ 90-21.102. General Assembly Of North Carolina Session 2011 Subject to subsection (b) of this section, a health care provider who engages in the 1 (a) 2 voluntary provision of health care services at any location in this State in association with a 3 sponsoring organization shall not be liable for damages for injuries or death alleged to have 4 occurred by reason of an act or omission in the health care provider's voluntary provision of 5 health care services, unless it is established that the injuries or death were caused by gross 6 negligence, wanton conduct, or intentional wrongdoing on the part of the health care provider. The immunity from civil liability provided by subsection (a) of this section does not 7 (b) 8 apply if any of the following circumstances exist: 9 The health care provider receives, directly or indirectly, any type of (1)compensation, benefits, or other consideration of any nature from any person 10 11 for the health care services provided. The health care services provided are not part of the health care provider's 12 (2) 13 training or assignment. 14 The health care services provided are not within the scope of the health care (3) 15 provider's license or authority.

- 16(4)The health care services provided are not authorized by the appropriate17authorities to be performed at the location."
- 18 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective January 1, 2013.
