The presentation of the required photographic identification may be at the time of the delivery		
of the prescription to the pharmacy, or at the time of the issue of the Schedule II controlled		
substance, in accordance with the procedures in this section.		
(b) Documentation and Record Keeping Upon presentation of the required		
photographic identification, the pharmacy shall document all of the following:

The pharmacy shall retain this identifying information on the premises or at a central location

(c) <u>Dispensation. – The person seeking the dispensation may provide the pharmacy</u>		
with a list of persons authorized to receive Schedule II controlled substances on the person's		
behalf, if the pharmacy has established a policy of keeping such an authorized list for its		
customers.

 - (e) <u>Health Care Facilities. Nothing in this section shall apply to the dispensation of controlled substances to employees of "health care facilities," as that term is defined in G.S. 131E-256(b), when the controlled substances are delivered to the health care facilities for the benefit of residents or patients of such health care facilities."</u>

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective January 1, 2012.

G.S. 90-113.73 is deemed in compliance with this subsection.

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
