2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAWS GOVERNING RENDERING PLANTS AND
3 OPERATIONS, TO REQUIRE CERTIFICATION OF GREASE OWNERSHIP BY
4 COLLECTORS OF WASTE KITCHEN GREASE, AND TO CREATE CRIMINAL
5 PENALTIES RELATED TO WASTE KITCHEN GREASE.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.** The title of Article 14A of Chapter 106 of the General Statutes reads
8 as rewritten:

9 "Article 14A.

10 Licensing and Regulation of Rendering ~~Plants and Plants~~, Rendering ~~Operations~~. Operations,
11 and Waste Kitchen Grease Collection."

12 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 106-168.1 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read as
13 follows:

14 "(6) "Waste kitchen grease" means animal fats or vegetable oils that have been
15 used, and will not be reused, for cooking in a food establishment. "Waste
16 kitchen grease" does not include grease septage as defined in
17 G.S. 130A-290."

18 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 106-168.5 reads as rewritten:

19 **"§ 106-168.5. Duties of Commissioner upon receipt of application; inspection committee.**

20 Upon receipt of the application, the Commissioner shall promptly cause the rendering plant
21 and equipment, or the plans, specifications, and selected site, of the applicant to be inspected by
22 an inspection committee hereinafter called the "committee," which shall be composed of three
23 members: One member who shall be designated by the Commissioner of Agriculture and who
24 shall be an employee of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, one member
25 who shall be designated by the Secretary of Health and Human Services and who shall be an
26 employee of the Department of Health and Human Services, and one member who shall be
27 designated by the ~~director~~ board of directors of the North Carolina ~~Division of the Southeastern~~
28 Renderers Association, and who shall be a person having practical knowledge of rendering
29 operations. Each member may be designated and relieved from time to time at the discretion of
30 the designating authority. No State employee designated as a member of the committee shall
