## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REGULATE HUNTING WHILE IMPAIRED ON PRIVATE LAND IN ROCKINGHAM COUNTY.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 SECTION 1. It is unlawful to hunt with a firearm or archery equipment upon the 6 land of another while under the influence of alcohol. A person shall be deemed to be under the 7 influence if that person has a blood alcohol concentration of .08 or greater as measured by an 8 Alcosensor or any alcohol screening device approved by the Department of Health and Human 9 Services for use by law enforcement officers in making on-the-scene tests of persons for alcohol concentration. Refusal to submit to a test shall be admissible as evidence in court. 10

SECTION 2. It is unlawful to hunt with a firearm or archery equipment upon the 11 12 land of another while under the influence of any impairing substance other than alcohol by 13 virtue of consuming a sufficient quantity of that substance so as to cause loss of normal control of bodily or mental faculties, or both, to such an extent that there is an appreciable impairment 14 15 of either or both of these faculties. A person shall be deemed to be so impaired if that person tests positive for any amount of a Schedule I controlled substance under G.S. 90-89 or its 16 metabolites in the person's blood or urine. 17

18 SECTION 3. Violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor. Any person 19 convicted of violating this section shall also be ordered to complete a hunter safety course 20 approved by the Wildlife Resources Commission as described in G.S. 113-270.1A(b).

21 SECTION 4. This act is enforceable by law enforcement officers of the Wildlife 22 Resources Commission, by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, and by other law enforcement officers 23 with general subject matter jurisdiction. 24

- **SECTION 5.** This act applies only to Rockingham County.
- SECTION 6. This act becomes effective October 1, 2011, and applies to offenses 25 26 committed on or after that date.
