A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT STUDENTS FROM DROPPING OUT OF SCHOOL BEFORE THE AGE OF SEVENTEEN.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-378(a) reads as rewritten:

"(a) Every parent, guardian or custodian in this State having charge or control of a child between the ages of seven and 1617 years shall cause the child to attend school continuously for a period equal to the time which the public school to which the child is assigned shall be in session, unless the child graduates from high school. Every parent, guardian, or custodian in this State having charge or control of a child under age seven who is enrolled in a public school in grades kindergarten through two shall also cause the child to attend school continuously for a period equal to the time which the public school to which the child is assigned shall be in session unless the child has withdrawn from school."

SECTION 2. G.S. 115C-238.66(3) reads as rewritten:

"(3) School attendance. – Every parent, guardian, or other person in this State having charge or control of a child who is enrolled in the regional school and who is less than 1617 years of age shall cause such child to attend school continuously for a period equal to the time that the regional school shall be in session, unless the child graduates from high school. No person shall encourage, entice, or counsel any child to be unlawfully absent from the regional school. Any person who aids or abets a student's unlawful absence from the regional school shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. The principal shall be responsible for implementing such additional policies concerning compulsory attendance as shall be adopted by the board of directors, including regulations concerning lawful and unlawful absences, permissible excuses for temporary absences, maintenance of attendance records, and attendance counseling."

SECTION 3. G.S. 116-235(b)(2) reads as rewritten:

"(2) School Attendance. – Every parent, guardian, or other person in this State having charge or control of a child who is enrolled in the School and who is less than 1617 years of age shall cause such child to attend school continuously for a period equal to the time which the School shall be in session. session, unless the child graduates from high school. No person shall encourage, entice, or counsel any child to be unlawfully absent from the School. Any person who aids or abets a student's unlawful absence from the School shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. The



1 Chancellor of the School shall be responsible for implementing such 2 additional policies concerning compulsory attendance as shall be adopted by 3 the Board of Trustees, including regulations concerning lawful and unlawful 4 absences, permissible excuses for temporary absences, maintenance of 5 attendance records, and attendance counseling." 6 **SECTION 4.** G.S. 7B-1501(27) reads as rewritten: 7 "(27) Undisciplined juvenile. – 8 A juvenile who, while less than 1617 years of age but at least 6 years a. 9 of age, is unlawfully absent from school; or is regularly disobedient 10 to and beyond the disciplinary control of the juvenile's parent, 11 guardian, or custodian; or is regularly found in places where it is unlawful for a juvenile to be; or has run away from home for a period 12 13 of more than 24 hours; or 14 A juvenile who is 16 or 17 years of age and who is regularly b. 15 disobedient to and beyond the disciplinary control of the juvenile's 16 parent, guardian, or custodian; or is regularly found in places where 17 it is unlawful for a juvenile to be; or has run away from home for a period of more than 24 hours." 18 **SECTION 5.** G.S. 143B-805(20) reads as rewritten: 19 20 "(20) Undisciplined juvenile. – 21 A juvenile who, while less than 16.17 years of age but at least 6 years 22 of age, is unlawfully absent from school; or is regularly disobedient 23 to and beyond the disciplinary control of the juvenile's parent, 24 guardian, or custodian; or is regularly found in places where it is 25 unlawful for a juvenile to be; or has run away from home for a period 26 of more than 24 hours; or A juvenile who is 16 or 17 years of age and who is regularly 27 b. 28 disobedient to and beyond the disciplinary control of the juvenile's 29 parent, guardian, or custodian; or is regularly found in places where 30 it is unlawful for a juvenile to be; or has run away from home for a

period of more than 24 hours."

SECTION 6. This act becomes effective July 1, 2013.
