Short Title: Fayetteville/May Disclose Police Compliant. (Local)

2 AN ACT TO ALLOW THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE TO DISCLOSE LIMITED  
3 PERSONNEL INFORMATION TO MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS REVIEW BOARD  
4 TO FACILITATE ITS REVIEW OF POLICE COMPLAINT INVESTIGATIONS.  
5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  
6 SECTION 1. G.S. 160A-168 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:  
7 "(c4) In order to facilitate citizen review of the police complaint process, when a person  
8 wishes to appeal the results of a complaint investigation, the city manager or the chief of police  
9 or their designees may release the disposition of disciplinary charges against a police officer  
10 and the facts relied upon in determining the disposition to the Police Citizen Review Board.  
11 Board members shall maintain as confidential all personnel information released to them under  
12 this subdivision that is not a matter of public record under this section, and any member who  
13 violates this confidentiality is guilty of the violations set forth in subsections (e) and (f) of this  
14 section. Each member of the Board shall execute and adhere to a confidentiality agreement that  
15 is satisfactory to the city. For purposes of this subsection, the "disposition of disciplinary  
16 charges" includes determinations that the charges are not sustained, unfounded, exonerated,  
17 classified as an information file, or classified as any other disciplinary disposition category  
18 subsequently adopted by the Fayetteville Police Department."  
19 SECTION 2. This act applies to the City of Fayetteville only.  
20 SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
