Jail Dormitory Minimum Standards.

Senators Woodard and McKissick (Primary Sponsors). Sponsors: Referred to: 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW PROVIDING FOR MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR JAIL 3 DORMITORIES TO ALLOW COUNTIES WITH POPULATIONS IN EXCESS OF TWO 4 HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND INMATES TO HOUSE SIXTY-FOUR INMATES PER 5 DORMITORY SO LONG AS CERTAIN MINIMUM STANDARDS ARE MET. 6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 153A-221(d) reads as rewritten: 7 8 Notwithstanding any law or rule to the contrary, each dormitory in a county ''(d)9 detention facility may house up to 64 inmates as long as the dormitory provides all of the 10 following: 11 (1) A minimum floor space of 70 square feet per inmate, including both the 12 sleeping and dayroom areas. One shower per eight inmates, one toilet per eight inmates, one sink with a 13 (2) security mirror per eight inmates, and one water fountain. 14 15 A telephone jack or other telephone arrangement provided within the (3) dormitory. 16 17 (4) Space designed to allow a variety of activities. Sufficient seating and tables for all inmates. 18 (5) A way for officers to observe the entire area from the entrance. 19 (6) This subsection applies only to those counties that have a population in excess of 20 21 300,000,250,000, according to the most recent decennial federal census." 22 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
