Short Title: Allison's Law/Use of GPS Tracking Device/DVPO. (Public)

3 A DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROTECTIVE ORDER THE USE OF A GPS TRACKING
4 DEVICE ON A PERSON WHO HAS COMMITTED ACTS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 SECTION 1. G.S. 50B-3(a) is amended by adding the following new subdivision
7 to read:

8 "(a) If the court, including magistrates as authorized under G.S. 50B-2(c1), finds that an
9 act of domestic violence has occurred, the court shall grant a protective order restraining the
10 defendant from further acts of domestic violence. A protective order may include any of the
11 following types of relief:

12 ...

13 (9a) Order a defendant the court finds has committed an act of domestic violence
14 to be subject to electronic monitoring by means of a Global Positioning
15 System (GPS) tracking device or other similar device that sends a signal
16 indicating the defendant's location to both the aggrieved party and the local
17 law enforcement agency when the defendant is near or at any prohibited
18 location. The GPS tracking device or other similar device shall be worn for
19 the period fixed in the order. The defendant subject to electronic monitoring
20 pursuant to this subdivision shall be responsible for paying any costs
21 associated with use of the device.

23 SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2014, and applies to offenses
24 committed on or after that date.
