  - No copy of a military discharge document or any other information from such document filed after the effective date of this section shall be made available other than in accordance with subsection (b) or (h) of this section.

Subsection (d)Subsection (e) of this section shall not apply to images of military (m) discharge documents that have been on file for over <del>50 years.</del> 80 years.

**SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to the release of discharge documents after that date and to the release of any other information from those documents after that date.
