- (d) Administration. The State grants provided for in this section shall be administered by the Authority pursuant to rules adopted by the Authority not inconsistent with this section. The Authority shall pay the State grant to each student eligible under this section. The amount of the grant for each student shall be eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000) per academic year. The grant shall be paid directly to the student on or after July 1 following the completion of the academic year. The Authority shall not remit any grant until it receives proper certification from an institution that the student applying for the grant is an eligible student.
- (e) Shortfall. In the event there are not sufficient funds to provide each eligible student with a full grant, each eligible student shall receive a pro rata share of funds for the grant then available for the appropriate academic year within the fiscal period covered by the current appropriation.
 - (f) Reversion. Any remaining funds shall revert to the General Fund.
- (g) Student enrollment documented. The Authority shall document the number of eligible students that are enrolled in approved institutions and the State funds collected by students at each approved institution under this section. The Authority shall report those findings to the Senate and House of Representatives Appropriations Subcommittees on Education and the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee."
- **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State Education Assistance Authority the sum of eight hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$825,000) for the 2013-2014 fiscal year and the sum of eight hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$825,000) for the 2014-2015 fiscal year to fund the North Carolina Optometry Education Grant Program established in G.S. 116-290, as enacted by Section 1 of this act.
- **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2013, and applies to the 2013-2014 academic year and each subsequent academic year.
