1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO REPEAL THE REQUIREMENT THAT LOCAL GOVERNMENTS DEVELOP 3 AND MAINTAIN A SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 SECTION 1. G.S. 130A-309.09A reads as rewritten: 6 "§ 130A-309.09A. Local government solid waste responsibilities. 7 The governing board of each unit of local government shall assess local solid waste (a) 8 collection services and disposal capacity and shall determine the adequacy of collection 9 services and disposal capacity to meet local needs and to protect human health and the 10 environment. Each unit of local government shall implement programs and take other actions that it determines are necessary to address deficiencies in service or capacity required to meet 11 12 local needs and to protect human health and the environment. A unit of local government may adopt ordinances governing the disposal, in facilities that it operates, of solid waste generated 13 14 outside of the area designated to be served by the facility. Such ordinances shall not be construed to apply to privately operated disposal facilities located within the boundaries of the 15 unit of local government. 16 17 Each unit of local government, either individually or in cooperation with other units (b) 18 of local government, shall develop a 10-year comprehensive solid waste management plan. Units of local government shall make a good-faith effort to achieve the State's forty 19 percent (40%) municipal solid waste reduction goal and to comply with the State's 20 comprehensive solid waste management plan. Each unit of local government shall develop its 21 solid waste management plan with public participation, including, at a minimum, one 22 23 advertised public meeting. The Department shall assist units of local government in the preparation of the plan required by this subsection if the unit of local government requests 24 25 assistance. Each plan shall be updated at least every three years. In order to assure compliance 26 with this subsection, each unit of local government shall provide the Department with a copy of 27 its current plan upon request by the Department. Each plan shall: 28 Evaluate the solid waste stream in the geographic area covered by the plan. (1)29 Include a goal for the reduction of municipal solid waste on a per capita (2)basis by 30 June 2001 and a goal for the further reduction of municipal solid 30 waste by 30 June 2006. The solid waste reduction goals shall be determined 31 32 by the unit or units of local government that prepare the plan, and shall be determined so as to assist the State, to the maximum extent practical, to 33 34 achieve the State's forty percent (40%) municipal solid waste reduction goal

35 as set out in G.S. 130A-309.04(c).
